



Withdrawal From Class

Residential undergraduate and graduate students: A \$10 fee will be charged to the student’s account for each withdrawal. The last day for students to withdraw from a course is Friday of the 12th week of a long term or the corresponding day when 80 percent of the course is completed for other short sessions. For students enrolled in Block Tuition, classes withdrawn from will still count toward the 36 credit hour total for the academic year.

Full-time undergraduate students may not withdraw from BIBL 101, BIBL 103, or any required developmental course.

Online undergraduate and graduate students: An online student may withdraw from a course up until the end of the business day on the Wednesday prior to the last week of the course. See the ACU Online academic calendar for withdrawal deadlines.
